What's Model UN?

In Model UN, you play the role of a delegate to the United Nations, from a country that you choose. You learn about your country, figure out who your friends and rivals are, see what world issues affect your citizens, and develop creative ideas to solve the problems you and others are facing.

Next, you bring your ideas, in the form of United Nations-style resolutions, to a simulated General Assembly, and present them to delegates from other countries for consideration, discussion and voting.

Our sessions emphasize collaboration, not competition, and dialogue, rather than debate. They're great for first-time Model UN delegates as well as for those who are returning.

What's in it for you?

Your ideas, interests and opinions are the fuel that drives Model UN. You'll meet other students who share your curiosity and your passion for making the world a better place. You'll make new friends from other schools: High-school students from more than 25 schools in the St. Louis area come to our Model UN General Assembly sessions.

What's a "Civitas?"

We've been doing Model UN since 1991. We're not part of a school or a religious group, or a political party. We don't charge you anything for our sessions. We just enjoy working with high-school students who are interested in global issues and in doing something meaningful for the world.

MUN-on-the-Go: Activities for your Model UN club

We've got some great activities to make your Model UN club meetings exciting and productive. If you want, we can come to your club and lead one or two of them for you.

Crisis simulation: We'll present a simulated world crisis and lead a session in which your club members react to it as delegates to the United Nations.

Current events discussion: We'll help you get your club talking about world events by leading a discussion on current issues.

Spontaneous Model UN: We'll bring a pre-written UN resolution for your club members to discuss, improve and vote on.

Introduction to UN + mini-session:

We'll lead an interactive session that helps club members understand what the UN is about, and we'll conduct a brief simulation of a United Nations session.

General Assembly preparation and resolution writing: We'll come to your club meeting to help delegates figure out how to write a resolution.
