Guns

- 1. Apparently the first gun was invented around the year 1000. The Chinese had invented gunpowder several hundred years before.
- 2. The presence of power of guns increased considerably through the centuries.
- 3. In the U.S. Constitution (1788), the Second Amendment addresses the issues of guns as follows:
 - a. A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.

- c. The term "commons sense gun laws" is often used. What do you think that it means?
- d. What do you think of the idea of arming teachers and administrators in schools?
- e. What do you think of individuals being able to carry concealed weapons in public?
- f. What do you think of individuals being able to "open carry" a weapon in public?
- g. Is there some point along the continuum from a small handgun to a nuclear weapon where you think that particular weapons should absolutely be forbidden for private ownership?
- 5. During his 2008 Democratic Presidential Primary race against Hillary Clinton, in an unguarded moment, Barack Obama said in reference to working-class voters in old industrial towns decimated by job losses, "They get bitter, they cling to guns or religion or antipathy to people who aren't like them or anti-immigrant or anti-trade sentiment as a way to explain their frustrations." Obama did not want that comment to be made public, but what do you think of the content of what he said?
- 6. So, the two "extremes" on the gun issue in the United States are:
 - a. There should be no restrictions on owning and/or carrying guns.
 - b. Guns should be outlawed except for law-enforcement officials. Hunters should be allowed to own or perhaps only rent guns.
- 7. Are you comfortable with either of these "extremes," or would you prefer policy to be somewhere in the middle? If so, where?
