3 **Re.:** Inadequate health care services in Zimbabwe  
4 **Submitted to:** General Assembly  
5 **Submitted by:** Zimbabwe  
6 **Date:** May 5, 2022  
7

8 **Whereas** Article 3 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “Everyone has  
9 the right to life, liberty, and security of person.”, and  
10

11 **Whereas** Article 25, section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states,  
12 “Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of  
13 himself and his family, including food, clothing, housing, and medical care, and  
14 necessary social services, and the right to security in the event of unemployment,  
15 sickness, disability, widowhood, old age, or other lack of livelihood in circumstances  
16 beyond his control.”, and  
17

18 **Noting that** Zimbabwe has been a part of the United Nations since 1980, and  
19

20 **Concerned that** Zimbabwe is estimated to have 1.1 million people HIV positive out of 13  
21 million people, and  
22

23 **Aware that** malaria is in the top three causes for death in Zimbabwe, and  
24

25 **Knowing that** in ten years, with help of USAID, cases of malaria have gone down 78 percent,  
26 and  
27

28 **Alarmed that** Tuberculosis is the second leading cause of death in Zimbabwe, and  
29

30 **Recognizing that** aids is still a problem in Zimbabwe,  
31

32 **Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**  
33

- 34 1. Create a program called Cure Care which will create health care services for a multitude of  
35 different medical concerns and provide a basic health care system in Zimbabwe.  
36
- 37 2. Mobile units would travel to rural areas and provide health care services. These would  
38 include checkups, vaccines, prenatal care and provide antibiotics on a regular basis.  
39
- 40 3. These health care units would also provide de-worming medication for soil and waterborne  
41 parasites.  
42
- 43 4. They would provide IV fluids and other treatments for dehydration.  
44

- 1 5. Zimbabwe is requesting \$375 million for these health care services and units as part of a 3-  
2 year pilot program.  
3
- 4 6. The program would reach 80% of the 10 million people in Zimbabwe's rural population  
5
- 6 7. If successful, we will request an additional \$750 million over the next ten-year period.  
7
- 8 8. We would allocate \$75 million for malaria vaccines, \$50 million for prenatal care, \$200  
9 million for mobile units including staffing and supplies and the remaining \$50 million would  
10 go towards antibiotics and additional vaccines as well as miscellaneous care supplies.

3 **Re.:** Improving Bribery  
4 **Submitted to:** General Assembly  
5 **Submitted by:** Cuba  
6 **Date:** May 5, 2022  
7

8 *Whereas* Article 7 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “All are equal  
9 before the law and are entitled without discrimination to equal protection of the law. All  
10 are entitled to equal protection against any discrimination in violation of this Declaration  
11 and against any incitement to such discrimination.”, and  
12

13 *Whereas* Article 21, section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states,  
14 “Everyone has the right to take part in the government of his country, directly or through  
15 freely chosen representatives.”, and  
16

17 *Whereas* Sustainable Development Goal #10 is Reduced Inequalities, and  
18

19 *Whereas* Sustainable Development Goal #17 is Partnerships For the Goals, and  
20

21 *Outraged* that it is common for Cuban government officials to engage in these bribes, and  
22

23 *Appalled* that hundreds of people at a time are arrested in riots against bribery and the  
24 government, and  
25

26 *Concerned* that the Cuban people do not have access to simple things due to bribery.  
27

28 **Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**  
29

- 30 1. Pressure the Cuban people with the use of the media to end bribes because to obtain simple  
31 things that should be provided, the Cuban people need to use bribery. The press can help  
32 report people and government officials that engage in bribes like these.  
33
- 34 2. If no one heeds to this warning, then with the help of the World Bank, we will reduce, and  
35 potentially cut, funding to Cuba.  
36
- 37 3. The UN can also provide supplies, like specific foods and medications, that would usually  
38 need a bribe to get to the Cuban people.  
39
- 40 4. In the scenario that none of these tactics work, we will need to ask these people to leave the  
41 country and never come back.  
42
- 43 5. Then, these people will be arrested for varying years, depending on the number of bribes they  
44 were caught for.

- 1 6. The budget will be about \$500,000 for the transportation vans, first aid kits, and money going  
2 towards the press.
- 3
- 4 7. For the first step, we will have the media put pressure for 6 months.
- 5
- 6 8. For the second, we will have the World Bank reduce the funding for another 6 months and  
7 then cut it completely after that for another year.
- 8
- 9 9. Hopefully, once we are finished, the bribery will have decreased by 50%, and will hopefully  
10 be able to solve problems without fighting.

8 **Whereas** Article 14 section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states,  
9 “Everyone has the right to seek and to enjoy in other countries asylum from  
10 persecution.”, (It’s Europe. Any European can go into other European countries and work  
11 there without needing anything like visas or other documents, except the document that  
12 shows your degree ) and  
13

14 **Whereas** Article 23 section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states,  
15 “Everyone has the right to work, to free choice of employment, to just and favorable  
16 conditions of work and to protection against unemployment.”, and  
17

18 **Whereas** Article 26, section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states,  
19 “Everyone has the right to education. Education shall be free, at least in the elementary  
20 and fundamental stages. Elementary education shall be compulsory. Technical and  
21 professional education shall be made generally available and higher education shall be  
22 equally accessible to all on the basis of merit.”, and  
23

24 **Noting that** Poland has been a member of the United Nations since October 24, 1945, and  
25

26 **Observing** Poland is taking in many refugees, and  
27

28 **Recognizing** Poland is overwhelmed by the amount of refugees and the funding needed to  
29 provide for them, and  
30

31 **Saddened by** lack of education and jobs for Ukrainian refugees, and  
32

33 **Convinced** Ukrainian refugees would benefit from schools that taught the children in their  
34 native language,  
35

36 **Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**  
37

- 38 1. Build schools for Ukrainian refugees.
- 39
- 40 2. Raising dues for the 10 highest paying countries by 5%.
- 41
- 42 3. Building schools by August 2022.
- 43
- 44 4. Requiring school principals to submit a report yearly making sure that the schools continue to  
45 educate refugees in the basic educational subjects, Math, Literature, and Science.

6 **Date:** May 5, 2022  
7

8 *Whereas* Sustainable Development Goal #10 is Reduced Inequalities, and

9  
10 *Whereas* Sustainable Development Goal #16 is Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions, and

11  
12 *Whereas* Article 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “All human  
13 beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They are endowed with reason and  
14 conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood.”, and

15  
16 *Whereas* Article 2 section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states,  
17 “Everyone is entitled to all the rights and freedoms set forth in this Declaration, without  
18 any distinction of any kind, such as race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other  
19 opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status.”, and

20  
21 *Whereas* Article 2 section 2 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states,  
22 “Furthermore, no distinction shall be made on the basis of political, jurisdictional or  
23 international status of the country or territory to which a person belongs, whether it be  
24 independent, trust, non-self-governing or under any other limitation of sovereignty.”, and

25  
26 *Concerned* that there is a rise in hate speech in Italy, and

27  
28 *Shocked* that more than half of Italians say that racist act are justifiable, and

29  
30 *Surprised* that Italy is one of the last European countries where anti-Semitism is common,

31  
32 **Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**

- 33  
34 1. We would like UN countries to put economic pressure on the Italian government to make a  
35 law that will allow more people to be respected and that everyone will have equal rights.  
36  
37 2. We would like these laws to extend to all people no matter their religion, race, sex, or gender  
38  
39 3. We would also like to make awareness programs to try to get more people to be more self-  
40 aware of things like racist words, language behavior, and hate crimes.  
41  
42 4. We would like these awareness programs to start in Central Rome which will last for 6  
43 months - a year.  
44  
45 5. If people start to recognize that racism is a big problem or when there are less reports about

1 hate crimes, these awareness programs will also be in Milan and Naples.

- 3 6. Hopefully when this happens, Italy's government officials will recognize this problem and
- 4 that they will try to put a big impact on this problem.
- 5
- 6 7. The program's main goal will be to get at least 10,000-15,000 Italians to go to these
- 7 programs.
- 8
- 9 8. Another main goal of this program would be to have Italians learn about other people's
- 10 culture including Africans which could teach Italians to be respectful about others' culture.
- 11
- 12 9. The targeted age group of people going to these programs will be 16-40 years old.
- 13
- 14 10. Some materials that we will need are flyers, and office space, a printer, ink, and public
- 15 speakers to announce the event.
- 16
- 17 11. The flyers will cost \$1500 because we need a high-quality printer for all of the flyers we give
- 18 to people.
- 19
- 20 12. The office space will cost \$240,000 because the program's goal is to last about 24 months
- 21 and the rent per month is about \$10,000 so we did 24 times \$10,000 to get \$240,000.
- 22
- 23 13. The public speakers will cost about \$1,603,000 because there will be 5 public speakers who
- 24 each get \$10,000 as their hiring bonus and \$2000 for each event that they speak at with there
- 25 being 16 events. This comes out to \$1,600,000. These programs will also have special
- 26 speakers that come out once every 8 months resulting in 3 special speakers because the
- 27 program's goal is to last 24 months. Each special speaker will get \$1000 dollars for speaking
- 28 resulting in \$3000 for them. Now we have \$1,600,000 plus \$3000 resulting in \$1,603,000.
- 29 The printer and ink are \$1700 because we need \$200 for ink and the printer is \$1500.
- 30
- 31 14. After all of the costs we have \$1700 plus \$240,000 plus \$1,603,000 plus resulting in the total
- 32 cost being \$1,844,700.
- 33
- 34 15. The last step is to create an online poll to see how Italy now views racism.
- 35
- 36 16. If we see that at least 60-70% of Italians now view racism as a big problem, we will be
- 37 satisfied with what we have done.

- 35 1. Donetsk and Luhansk to be given a position at the United Nations

21 *Whereas* everyone has a right to good health and well being, and  
22

23 *Whereas* everyone has a right to peace, justice and strong institutions,  
24

25 **Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**  
26

- 27 1. My goal to helping France is reducing terrorist groups and providing an organization that  
28 prevents terrorism. This organization will provide safety and strength. (The organization)  
29
- 30 2. We can stock extra camera’s that will connect to the police department and the organization,  
31 so we always have eyes. (Cameras)  
32
- 33 3. We could have the government support us, so this isn’t just a little group trying to make a  
34 change. (Money support)  
35
- 36 4. We could add a button under stores’ desk in case a terrorist approaches them. So, that not  
37 only will the organization be notified but the police. (Safety button)/  
38
- 39 5. The organization could restock the airport of security daily, and in case you are ever under an  
40 attack teach people self-defense. The organization only works if you support them, they will  
41 support you. (Airport security)  
42
- 43 6. I would like to get a cell-phone line so If you ever need help or want more information, we  
44 will have staff members helping. We hope this organization will be a big deal, so all this

1 money won't go to waste. All that France needs is for this organization to be recognized.

2  
3 7. We can start in the capital of France, Paris and provide 1,500 cameras for watch and once  
4 this helps and people see that we will move out to other cities and provide more.

5  
6 8. The amount estimated of money we will need is 300,000 to pay employee's and cameras and  
7 security support. It also will be used to storage other supplies or if this organization doesn't

9

12
