

STL CHANGEMAKERS

is a free two-week summer program that gives teens an opportunity to explore St. Louis history, engage with today's most pressing issues, and develop projects focused on creating a better future for the St. Louis region.

In this program, local issues will be examined through the lens of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, with a focus on what it means to be an active and engaged citizen.

After completion of the program, each participant will receive a \$150 stipend.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

HISTORICAL UNDERSTANDING

Dive deep into the history of some of the most pressing issues facing the St. Louis region by exploring the exhibits and collections of the Missouri Historical Society.

GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE

Use the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals to make local connections to global issues and develop a deeper understanding of the world.



LOCAL ENGAGEMENT

Go out in the field, meet with community leaders, and learn what it means to be an active citizen by designing an impact project focused on creating change in the St. Louis region.



ELIGIBILITY

STL Changemakers is open to high school students in the greater St. Louis metro area who are entering grades 10 to 12. The program strives to intentionally recruit candidates from a wide variety of backgrounds.



DATES, TIMES, AND LOCATION

The 2023 summer session runs from June 12 to June 22 and meets on Monday through Thursday, 9am to 3pm, at the Missouri History Museum. During the school year, participants will meet a few times to continue working on the impact projects designed during the summer session.
